Our responders don't have that way of thinking. In fact, one of the mottos of responders have is we will do whatever is needed to make sure everyone goes home at the end of shift. The spouses and family members of responders often have anxiety of what may happen to their loved one who is serving the community. This again came to mind on Nov 6 when a driver struck and <u>killed a Golden Officer</u> and <u>severely injured another</u>. The <u>funeral</u> was held at <u>Mission Hills Church</u>. Kevin Shive, our Executive Director and Chaplain for Golden PD helped lead the service for Officer Dunn. Please be in prayer for his wife and for Officer Grusing as she recovers.

We never know what the day will hold or what our future may look like. While we may not be involved in an accident, a shooting, or run into a fire, each day brings with it circumstances that can changes us forever. Please remember to pray for our responders, their families, and the chaplains that come along side them. Remember not to take life for granted and make the most of every day with those you care about.

This past month I had the opportunity to meet with potential new chaplains and I am gearing up to head down to Arizona to train 18 people who have signed up to participate in our basic chaplain training. Please pray for those who are considering this call on their life to serve those who serve us.

I also had the privilege to share about the mission of Emergency Responder Chaplaincy with <u>Fellowship of Christ Church</u> in Monument, CO. They are one of our supporting churches and hope to become more involved in supporting our responders and chaplains.
